STATUTES

- Controlled Substances Act
 - Regulates manufacture, importation, possession, use, and distribution of controlled substances
- <u>Substance-Use Disorder Prevention Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients</u> and Communities Act of 2018 (SUPPORT)
 - Allows buprenorphine prescribing to qualified Nurse Practitioners (NPs), Physician Assistants (PAs), Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNSs), Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNAs), and Certified Nurse-Midwifes (CNMs) until October 1, 2023.
 - Expands criteria for prescribers to treat up to 100 patients with buprenorphine in the first year.
- Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act of 2016 (CARA)
 - Coordinates the six pillars: prevention, treatment, recovery, law enforcement, criminal justice reform, and overdose reversal
 - Endorses use of MAT and increases prescriber maximum number of patients on buprenorphine from 30 to 100.

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STATUTES

- Drug Addiction Treatment Act of 2000 (DATA)
 - Allows qualifying physician to treat opioid dependency with FDA approved narcotic medications outside of opioid treatment programs
 - Created waiver allowing separate requirements from NATA for treating opioid dependency with schedule III, IV, and V medications
 - Buprenorphine Waiver Training Information
 - <u>Physician Buprenorphine Waiver Training</u> (8 hours)
 - <u>Nurses Buprenorphine Waiver Training</u> (NPs, CNSs, CRNAs, CNMs) (24 hours)
 - <u>Physician Assistant Buprenorphine Waiver Training</u> (24 hours)
 - <u>Prescribing Buprenorphine Without a Waiver During Special Circumstances</u>
- Narcotic Addict Treatment Act of 1974 (NATA)

REGULATIONS

- <u>Certification of Opioid Treatment Programs, 42 Code of Federal Regulations 8</u>
 - Provides accreditation and certification for opioid treatment programs
 - Includes regulations for using opioid medications to treat OUD
 - Shifts oversight of these treatments from the FDA to SAMHSA
- <u>Certification of Opioid Treatment Programs, 42 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 2</u>
 - Protects patient confidentiality regarding records pertaining to substance use treatment
- Final Rule by SAMHSA Regarding Opioid Drugs in Maintenance and Detoxification Treatment of Opiate Addiction - 2001
